Business courses in the areas of accounting, marketing, business law, management, and management information systems, along with specific economics, English, and mathematics courses are offered to provide students with the first two years of a baccalaureate degree in business. The suggested curriculum meets the requirements for admission as a junior to degree programs in business administration and accounting at most colleges and universities. Students are also provided the opportunity to combine business administration with an area of emphasis in management information systems.

Objectives

- Provide the basic business courses for the first two years of a baccalaureate degree in accounting, business administration, or management information systems.
- Provide specific required courses in mathematics, computer science, social science, science, and humanities required for a baccalaureate degree in accounting, business, or management information systems.
- Help the student understand those principles, concepts, and theories that affect business by offering specific accounting, business, and management information systems courses.

Notes

- Students who plan to transfer to a four-year college/university should consult their faculty advisor and their Transfer Advisor early in their WNCB enrollment to determine their curriculum.
- Human Relations may be counted as a Social Science graduation requirement for this program.
- Students may enroll in Marketing Internship or Management Internship after completing 30 or more credits of the Business Administration program with a 3.0 or higher GPA. All Internships must be pre-approved by the Internship Instructor.
- Recommended social science courses: ECON-2230, ECON-2260, POLS-2350, POLS-2390, and SOCI-2630.
